"When I was in the Marine Corps our ship one time was at the northeastern corner of Formosa (now called Taiwan) near Taipei. We stopped there at the mouth of the harbor and awaited the arrival of the harbor pilot, who came out and took the wheel of the ship and began to weave us through the pathless waters that led to the dock itself. At first glance that seemed like an unnecessary thing to do. We could see the dock less than a mile ahead. But the closer we looked and the longer we looked over the side of the ship into the crystal clear waters, we could tell why. There were mines located randomly beneath the surface of the water. If the hull of our ship had nudged a mine just enough, disaster would have occurred. But the pilot of the harbor knew where every mine was located."

"The Hebrew word here for 'guidance' is comparable to 'steering a ship'. God uses the wisdom of godly people to steer us in the right direction."

What does our need for others' wisdom teach us about the Body of Christ?

"Nearly every king mentioned in Scripture relied on advisers to share their wisdom in difficult situations. David and Solomon turned to their trusted counselors when in need. Moses spoke with his father-in-law. In the early church the believers looked to the disciples for counsel. Even Paul had those he could turn to for wisdom. Ken's Thoughts on Filtering Godly Counsel

1. Godly counsel is consistent with Scripture.
2. Godly counsel should be filtered with solitude and prayer.
3. Consider fasting as a part of your filtering process.
4. If the counsel is far different than you expected, go and seek out two other Godly people.

5. Who is the best person for you to talk through these issues with?

"If you find that you need specific counsel, seek out a godly person who is an expert in that area or who has experience in the very circumstances in which you find yourself. Follow the suggestions that are based upon God's Word. None of us do well in walking through life alone. We need to be in close communication and association with other people who believe in Christ Jesus, are studying God's Word, and are seeking to follow Christ daily. We need to spend some time with people who have been through experiences that we are facing. We also need to spend time with people who have succeeded in an area of life in which we would also like to succeed. We need to talk things over with them, learn from them, and receive their wise counsel."
